Answer Brief

I, Martin White, Personal Representative for the Estate of Russell Fred White, Deceased, proceeding Pro Se, files the following answer brief.

1. Mr. Campbell makes reference to record and citation. I have not received any record or citation to see what he is commenting on. For that matter, I have not received anything from Attorney Campbell.

2. How does anyone looking at the document that Kreiser produced take this to be a legal document? The document does not even state that this was a gift. This document was handwritten by Kreiser in the hospital room of my father, while he was under the influence of Morphine, Hydrocodone and Phenergan. The last line on this document was obviously added by Kreiser at a later time.

3. Mr. Campbell states that my father, Russell White, "accomplished several transactions" to add Kreiser to his accounts to take care of "his friend" . Defendant Kreiser has testified that she had never been to my father's house BEFORE she had him sign these documents. Kreiser even testified that she had never driven past his house PRIOR to having him sign the documents that she created in his hospital room. She is just simply a crook that preys on the elderly.
4. Mr. Campbell takes the position that a law that deals with bank transactions should preside over this case. The law that deals with this case is Florida Statute 825.103. Claiming that some law that deals with bank accounts has anything to do with this case is ridiculous. What if Kreiser had put a gun to the head of a teller and told her to add her to the account and had then walked out of the bank with the paperwork.

Would attorney Campbell take the position that “she’s on the account so we need to argue banking law”? I would hope not. That would be a felony.

If Kreiser had test driven a car and not returned it to the dealership, would attorney Campbell take the position that the keys were given to her, so there is no crime? Of course not.

But attorney Campbell wants us to believe that Florida Statute 825.103 should not apply to the crime that Kreiser committed here. The statute makes clear that what Kreiser has produced here is a felony. What Kreiser did fits with the elements of this statute. Kreiser committed a felony by producing these documents. Period. There is no banking law that erases a felony. **Exhibit 2**

5. Kreiser has made ripping off the elderly and vulnerable a way of life.

6. How could Kreiser have gotten away with this?

Kreiser benefitted by a (still) corrupt Okaloosa County Sheriff’s Dept.

At the time that Kreiser committed these crimes the Sheriff was Charlie Morris.

He is now in Federal prison for corruption theft and several other employees of the Okaloosa County Sheriff’s Dept. have been arrested. They weren’t doing their jobs.

7. Therefore I am stuck (for now) with a still corrupt Okaloosa County legal system that requires that victims of crimes must sue in civil court instead of receiving justice via the criminal system. I had to sue Kreiser for what she stole from my father. Ellen Berg, an elderly woman also had to sue Kreiser for the theft that was committed by Kreiser. **Exhibit 4**

Therefore I request that you affirm the final order from the lower court so that I can get on with my life and Ida Marie Kreiser can go to prison.
